



Green light for Lynch's Victoria scheme

Lynch Architects has received planning permission for a £160 million mixed-use development on Victoria Street in central London.

The scheme, which will see the demolition of Kingsgate House, includes two buildings of 12 and 14 storeys, incorporating a mix of retail, office and housing space. It will also feature new public realm areas.

Westminster Council last night approved the plans, despite objections from English Heritage and criticism from Design Council Cobe, which included concerns about the distances between buildings and the design of the ground and first floor levels.

Patrick Lynch said: "We're very happy and we feel vindicated by the planning process."

The project is being developed by Land Securities.
